

# Nordkap's Meatball Dinner again a Hit at Scandinavian Market

After a two-year pause during the pandemic, Nordkap Lodge returned in November to the Scandinavian Market and found that hungry shoppers still love our meatball dinner.

**We sold approximately 120 dinners** in the Finnish Center lounge in Farmington Hills. Each meal included meatballs and gravy, potatoes, red cabbage, cucumber salad, crispbread, and coffee or lemonade for \$11 with a credit card (or \$10 cash). We also sold 60 Norwegian waffles with strawberry jam and sour cream for \$5.

At our Nordkap store inside the main hall, we practically sold out of imported Norwegian foods and gifts.

# Special sales at the store raised \$443 for the Nordkap Scholarship Fund.

# Norway's Tubfrin Charity Ceases Operations

**The owner of Tubfrim**, Norway's National Association for Public Health, has shut down Tubfrim's operations. Among the reasons given were a drastic decrease in the amount of collected stamps and negative prospects for continuing to produce a profit.

The National Association for Public Health, the board of Tubfrim, and staff at Tubfrim thanked everyone who collected and sent stamps to Tubfrim over almost 100 years.

**But you may not want to stop** saving and trimming your used stamps for charity just yet! Our Fifth District Sons of Norway leaders are exploring other charitable options for lodges to send their stamps to. In the meantime, the District asks that you hold all stamps.

**Tubfrim was established in 1928** in Nesbyen, Norway, by postmaster Ditlef Frantzen. Nesbyen is located in the traditional district of Hallingdal. Tubfrim collected and sold used stamps, with profits used for tuberculosis work among children in Norway. Tubfrim was transferred to the National Association for Public Health in 1947. There were also changes to what the profits were used for. Most recently, the profits went to health and well-being measures for children and young people in Norway, and to the fight against tuberculosis.
